

A Little too late for Leeds u/11s!

A composed Hull side ended Leeds recent run of good form in this Carnegie Trans-Pennine League match running out deserved 5-2 winners. Leeds started brightly and dominated much of the early play with Henry Dolby and Tristan Brennan controlling the midfield.
