It felt rather strange turning up at St.Theresas for the 1st time in months to play a game, hoping that maybe the grass had been cut. No such joy and although the pitch is very well drained the length of the grass and the bobbly bounce would make good football a difficult task. Leeds got the best possible start with a goal inside 15 seconds when Josh Stones through ball was pounced on by Cole Roberts who evaded two tackles to steer the ball home. It was another 20 minutes before a strong run and mazy dribble by Stones ended up with a close range tap in. Scarborough had battled away but the second goal knocked the stuffing out of them.
