- In the first instance contact your Association Safeguarding Officer or Secretary.
- If required Association Safeguarding Officer can seek support from ESFA Safeguarding Officers.
- Where appropriate the Association Safeguarding Officer/ Secretary can elevate to **ESFA Safeguarding Officers**.

Remember if your concern relates to a emergency because a child or children are at immediate risk, then please contact Police/Children Services within your area.
